- Illinois Mandated Reporter (ILMR gsLearn course)
- Understanding Your Role (gsLearn course)

# **Camp Activities**

### Journeys & Outdoor Badge/Patchwork:

There are so many fun badges/patches you can do with your girls at camp! You can also complete the Outdoor Journey throughout the course of a camping trip. Go to the website or the VTK to explore the different outdoor badges/patches and the Outdoor Journey for each grade level.

### **Skill Building:**

Camping trips are also a great time to teach girls new outdoor skills and build upon the ones they already know. These skills are often associated with badgework as well! Some ideas are...

- Orienteering
- Knives/Tools
  - whittling
  - food prep
  - knife sharpening & cleaning
  - Using an axe and saw to cut wood
- Fire Building
  - One Match Patch
  - construct & extinguish a fire
  - make different fire starters
  - o make a buddy burner
- Plant Identification
  - identify poison ivy, oak, and sumac
  - identify different tree species

- 3. Can the first aider and the camp trained adult be the same person? Yes
