What will Girl Scouting cost?

National Membership

Dues: \$12.00

Required

The proceeds from annual membership dues go to the national organization, Girl Scouts of the USA, which publishes written resources, provides technical assistance to councils and promotes public understanding of Girl Scouting.

Troop Dues

Variable amounts

Strongly Recommended

This amount is determined by girls together with their leader/advisor. It is based on the program activities and supplies the troop wants to have during the year. To keep dues at a minimum, troops support themselves through product sales and money-earning projects.

Uniforms

Prices vary

Optional

Uniforms are not a requirement for membership. However, uniforms should be worn properly, if used. See below for locations where uniforms may be purchased.

Helpful Hint: Uniform exchange: Contact troops moving to the next level for uniforms. Patterns and fabric are also available if you wish to make uniform components.

Strongly Recommended

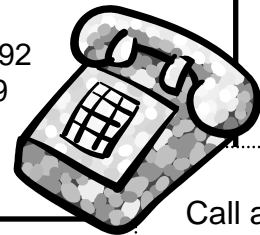
Handbooks are not a requirement of membership; however, they are beneficial for girls to use at troop meetings and to earn awards.

- Write a letter to the local newspaper
- Give a plaque/gift certificate
- Trace each girl's hand and reproduce it on a sweatshirt, apron, or tote
- Have a pizza and movie delivered to their home
- Ask the school for space to recognize leaders/advisors & troops
- Make an audio/video recording of each girl saying thank you in her own special way
- Create a collage of the troop
- Make a booklet of thank you pictures drawn by the girls
- Offer an evening of free babysitting
