Girl Scout Leadership Experience

- Girl-led: when girls play an active role in planning and implementing their activities
 - o Strategies:
 - Let the girls vote
 - Engage creativity
 - Have girls experiment
- Cooperative Learning: takes place when all members of a group are working together toward a common goal
 - o Strategies:
 - Have girls work in pairs or groups
 - Encourage & model good social skills
 - Use a Kaper Chart

- Learn by doing: a hands-on learning process that engages girls in continuous cycles of action and reflection
 - Strategies:
 - Encourage 'full-body" experiences (gross & fine motor skills and 5 senses are engaged)
 - Have girls try instead of watch
 - Create "hands-on" experiences
